


ROCKLAND DAY AT THE HOME

MEDAL OF VALOR AWARDED



On Mon, May 16, 2022, Sabrail Davenport and her grandsons received the Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor from President Joe Biden on behalf of her son and their father, Spring Valley firefighter Jared Lloyd.

The nation's highest civilian Medal of Honor, "is awarded to public safety officers who have exhibited exceptional courage, regardless of personal safety, in the attempt to save or protect others from harm," according to the White House.

Lloyd was among 15 first responders honored at the White House, and one of two who died in the line of duty.

Lloyd, 35, a second lieutenant, died helping to rescue 112 residents of the Evergreen Court Home for Adults during an inferno on March 22, 2021. A building section collapsed on Lloyd as he made a final search for residents of the Lafayette Avenue facility.

WORKING FIRES



May 10: 0214 hours, Dept. 6 (Hillcrest) dispatched to a structure fire at 110 East Willow Tree Road. 6-2 on arrival reports working fire on rear porch spreading. 44-1, 4 and 6 responding. 0219 7-FAST (Monsey) to the scene. 0222 17-Engine (Spring Valley) to the scene, 0230 20-Engine (Tallman) and 26-FAST (Thiells) to the scene. 02:36 19-Engine (Suffern) to the scene, 0246 23-FAST (West. Haverstraw) to the scene, BCI requested. 0303 9-Engine (New City) to the scene. 0336 18-Engine (Stony Point) to the scene. The fire from 44-1: a house divided into three separate housing units, with many voids, tongue and groove walls and heavy timber construction made for a very labor-intensive operation.



May 21: 16:31 hours. Dept. 26 (Thiells) and 23-FAST (West Haverstraw) dispatched to Bowline Plant for a roof fire. 44-Control reports several phone calls for a visible roof fire. This was an extremely hot day with temperatures in the 90s. There is one elevator to the roof. 26-1 reports roof fire of about 100' x 40'. 16:50 4-Engine (Haverstraw) to the scene. 44-4 responded. 17:21 18-Engine (Stony Point) to the scene. 17:32 3-Engine (Congers) to the scene. 17:42 6-Engine (Hillcrest) to the scene, 17:44 9-FAST (New City) to the scene. 17:45 7-Engine (Monsey) relocated to 26-100. The fire from 26-1 Chief Dan Coughlin: the fire was over 14 floors up providing many challenges to the firefighters. The fire started in an area

surrounding a steam pipe that releases steam at 1,000 degrees Fahrenheit. The fire was quickly spreading quickly in the void spaces and insulation areas of the roof membrane. Firefighters utilized a standpipe inside the plant with additional pressure fed the system with our engine 26-1501. EMS was requested to stand by the scene. With heat being a tremendous concern, multiple EMS agencies were on scene, Haverstraw, Spring Hill, Harriman, and South Orangetown. A cooling station *vas* made available by EMS as well as the administration building of the plant. There were no injuries to report. All units were cleared by 1954 hours.


April 4, 2022 was a momentous night for the Empire Hose Company #1. The Company elected our first female president in 171 years.



Charles Hoffman, died May 9, 2022, age 85; He was a member of Orangeburg Fire Department, 67 Year Life Member and Ex-Chief.








<u>Don G Freeman</u>, died May 23, age 83. He was a member of the Haverstraw Fire Department, Lady Warren Hose Co.5.

Trumpet June 2022 (2007)......15 Years Ago-Throwback! County-Wide Public Safety Communications Network Update

September 10, 2007 marked the official kick-off of Rockland County's new county-wide public safety communications network project.

The new network is a state-of-the-art digital trunking system that will replace numerous analog radio systems operating on different radio bands currently used by the county's public safety community. Designed to provide interoperable radio communications for all Rockland County first responders, it will remove blockages in emergency communications caused by today's incompatible frequency bands. Fire, police and EMS will all benefit equally from the network's county wide coverage, robustness and redundancy. Additionally, users will be only a channel click away from being able to talk directly to any other first responder across village and town boundaries.

The County network will serve each agency independently for day-to-day operations, however will support mutual aid and joint operations through common "talk groups" set aside for combined police, fire and EMS operations needed for emergency situations or special events.

More than 9 tower sites will support the network's design goal of providing county-wide portable radio coverage with in-building coverage in town police headquarters, hospital Emergency Departments and other critical buildings such as shopping malls. The towers are linked by microwave, removing the dependency on fragile telephone lines.

Motorola was chosen to supply the network, mobile and portable radio equipment. PierCon Solutions is acting as the county's project and construction managers while AVSTAR consulting is managing the site acquisition process.

The new network is "open architecture" meaning that mobile and portable radios can be purchased from numerous vendors such a Motorola, Kenwood, Icom, M/A-Com and others to encourage competition and maximize interoperability.

Anyone familiar with two-way radio will agree that coverage is the all-important element. The county recognizes this and so has been totally focused on the proper placement of towers to insure the network's basic performance. We're moving through the somewhat un-glamorous task of lease negotiations but we're anxious to provide you with more specific details of the network's features shortly. (See Photo on Page 5)
