July 8, 0340 hours: Dept. 6 (Hillcrest) 7-FAST (Monsey 7-75) and 17-Engine (Spring Valley) dispatched to a working structure fire at 312 N. Main St., Hillcrest. The fire was seen by a passing Ramapo PD car, already thru the roof. The fire originated in Peppes Pizzeria and Restaurant. in a taxpayer complex of stores. 44-1 reported that the fire did extend to exposures 2 and 4 slightly and many stores were opened and cocklofts checked for extension. For the most part, fire walls held. The following units were special called: 9-Tower (New City) 24-1750 (West Nyack), 8-Engine (Nanuet), 20-FAST Tallman, 26-99 (Thiells) and 44-12. 23-Engine (West

Haverstraw) and 18-Engine (Stony Point) were relocated to 6-101 in Thiells. Under control at 0644 hours.

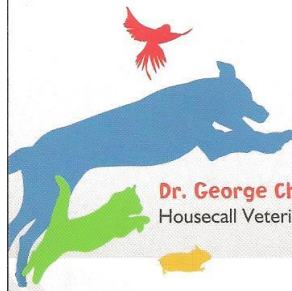

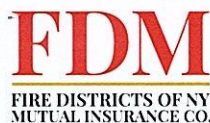

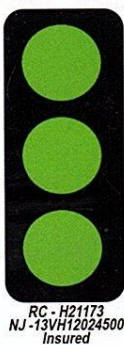

An Absolute Training Must

Two Maryland firefighter deaths, one a Lieutenant with Howard County (2018) and one a Battalion Chief with Frederick County (2021), have recently been thoroughly examined by the ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms) with a recent release of findings from each and identical fire cause and origin results. Each were large single family frame dwellings. Each were struck by lightning which caused arcing in the corrugated stainless-steel tubing (CSST) that ignited escaping gas resulting for an extended burning of combustible building materials in voids.

Conditions leading up to their deaths included fire burning undetected in a lower-level void, and each falling through a first floor into said lower level. Each called a 'May Day' and the rescue efforts were tremendous however, in time, not successful. Howard County Lieutenant Nathan Flynn and Frederick County Battalion Chief Josh Laird will always be remembered, and we now must use their deaths as a learning opportunity for us all.

ATF has utilized engineering analysis methods including field testing, laboratory testing, advanced computer modeling and data sources to determine the cause and origin of the fire, fire spread and events that led up to the "May Day" and LODD.

I have shared this report and link to the 40-minute video to the entire county fire service. There is no question that this should be viewed by all officers and firefighters. Furthermore, it should be included as part of your drill night. This video analysis is extremely well done and should be used to help prevent future tragic situations.
