I have been in the fire service for 65 years. I Joined the Tappan Fire Department June 1958. In 1958 I joined the USAF for a four-year tour, 1958-1962. During the past several years, I have joined the RCVFA Board of Directors, the Rockland County Fire Advisory Board representing the fire police, I am a Trustee with the

NJ/NY VA, and the Rockland County Fire Service Museum, I served as Commander of the Carl A. Schelin American Legion Post 1271 Tappan, 1986 to 2001. I was self- employed in lawn service during these years, trained in the proper use of pesticides and the safe disposal of these chemicals, I was trained with the use and disposal of hazardous chemicals concerning the environment. On March 5. 1988 I received hazardous material training and testing and receiving my Certified Pesticide Applicator License. Today, since I retired in 2022, I work at the Tappan Reformed Church donating my time and, also donate several hours a week at the Promenade Assisted Living Center, Veterans Memorial Drive in Pearl River. I do this to thank the personal for the care my wife Lillian received during the three and a half years she was at this facility. Today I am retired, and have two sons, married with all for being teachers.



PARK DEDICATED TO FOLEY BROTHERS



FDNY firefighters Thomas and Daniel Foley were memorialized in a beautiful tribute in West Nyack Sun, Sep 10, a place they called home and where they both served as volunteer firefighters. A life-sized statue of these brave brothers was unveiled at the West Nyack Hamlet Green and Firefighter Memorial Park.

Thomas Foley of Rescue 3 died on 9/11. His younger brother, Daniel, of Ladder 49, spent days searching for his body and eventually found him 10 days later. Daniel Foley joined Rescue 3 in the years following. He died of 9/11 related illnesses in 2020

WE SADLY REPORT THAT:

Joseph Maragliano died Sept. 2. 2023, age 75. He was a member of Empire Hook & Ladder Company #1 and the Nyack Fire Department. This was a Line of Duty death; he was a 54 Year Life Member. Joe joined Empire in June of 1969 and served as a company Lieutenant from 1978 to 1980 and Vice President from 2013 until his passing. During his tenure Joe played a key role in some of Nyack's largest fires. For the past 15 years he was the company's most active tillerman.

ANOTHER GAS LEAK?

Here are a few important facts about your 4 gas meter

WHAT....Why do I smell gas and my meter reads zero? Your 4 gas instrument has a catalytic bead sensor that is very reliable but is blind to about 2 % of the lower explosive limit (LEL).

SO WHAT? Humans can smell the odorant in natural gas (NG) at about 1 part per million (ppm). One ppm is equal to 1/16th of an inch (one ppm) to 1 mile (a million parts per million). 2% LEL is about 1000 ppm and your 4 gas cant detect it.

NOW WHAT? True explosive gas detectors have a lower detection level and use a metal oxide sensor. This sensor will get down to levels where humans can smell the odorant.

WHAT? Why does my 4 gas have a clip on the back?

SO WHAT? It is designed to clip on your gear and is for monitoring the air around your personal space. For flammable gases, it alarms at 10% LEL because that is the confined space standard alarm level. NOW WHAT? Now that you know the weakness of your 4 gas monitor consider pairing it up with a true explosive gas detector with a metal oxide sensor. There are many manufacturers, Sensit Technologies makes a good one, low cost, reliable, easy to maintain with a sensor with a long life span. It has a goose neck wand so you can reach up where the natural gas is or down where the propane or gasoline fumes maybe. - Jerry Knapp

CHANGES.....

As the new Fire Operations Building continues with some significant progress, there have been a few changes along the way......all for the better. Let's take a look at what's happening:

- A 32' wide driveway is being installed at the rear of the building onto Leak Street. Gas training shed to be relocated to the other side of Leak Street.
- Three windows are being added to the south side of the tower section.
- The west side driveway/pavement has been extended 10' for better maneuverability.
- Rear of the building driveway/pavement has been extended another 10'.
- Rear retaining wall extended by 10'.
- Due to a very high-water table, an underground culvert will run along the rear of the site.
- Numerous trees have been removed from all around the site. Opening it up very nice.
- Additional lighting will now be installed across from the building and along the perimeter of the site.

We are very hopeful that the building will be completed in mid to late December. Once complete, our fire instructors will need to be trained on the building. We are confident that this new building will gets tons of use. Especially running multiple evolutions at the same time. I have been sharing weekly photos of the progress with the County Fire Chiefs, Districts, Coordinators, Associations, and Fire Advisory Board.
